Dear Smarty,

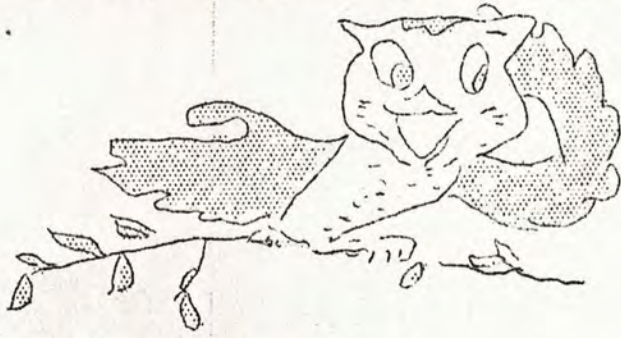

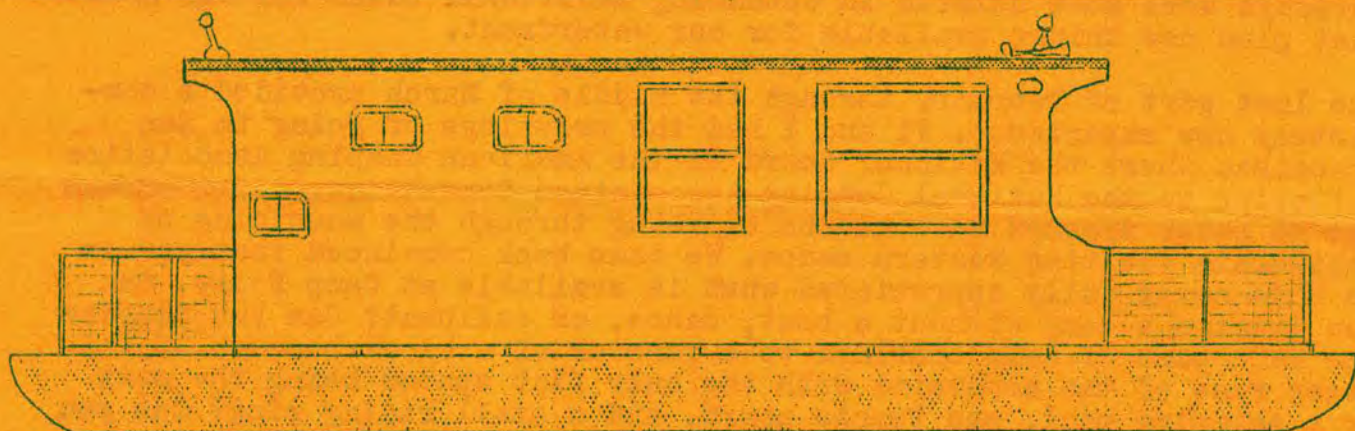

## HOUSEBOAT ADDED TO FLEET

The biggest news for 1960 is the addition of a 34 foot houseboat to the Camp Foley waterfront. This, the largest craft on the Whitefish Chain, is being custom built to accommodate an entire cabin group plus staff. An actual drawing of the craft heads this article. It will feature nine bunks, rest room, galley, eating area plus sufficient fore and aft decks for fishing, swimming, and just plain enjoyment of the open waters in the area. The boat will be an all weather craft powered by a 40 horse-power Evinrude motor. We have chosen a pontoon hull because of greater stability plus the advantage of easy beaching the craft on the sandy shores of the Whitefish Chain. Each cabin group will experience at least one trip a period and whenever time permits special requests will be honored for additional trips.

## 180 ATTEND TWIN CITY REUNION

The enthusiasm was overwhelming at the Twin City Reunion in January as the plans for the 1960 season were revealed. It goes without saying the splash party was popular as ever and everyone thoroughly enjoyed the traditional camp style picnic served in O'Shaughnessy Hall Lounge.

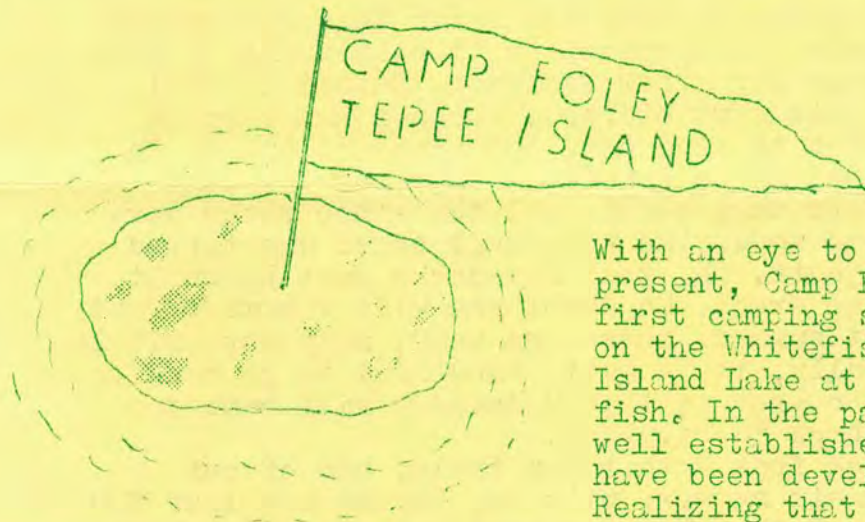

With an eye to the future, as well as the present, Camp Foley has purchased its first camping site away from home base on the Whitefish Chain. It is located in Island Lake at the eastern end of Whitefish. In the past few years many of the well established camp sites in the area have been developed with private cabins. Realizing that the success of good camps is dependent on secluded sites and

that a good camping experience should include such trips we are making every effort to preserve this very basic concept of our camping philosophy. As a special project older campers will be given the opportunity to help develop the island by preserving its natural beauty and by planting additional trees. It should be a real thrill for a fellow to return to the island in 1970 to see how his tree has flourished for the benefit of future campers.

## STAFF RETURNS UNUSUALLY HIGH

The swimming dock will again be under the able direction of Bob Handley, a senior at St. Thomas College, while the Athletic, Riflery, and Craft Programs will be headed by three year staff men from Loras College, Paul Yarbrough, Dave Manders, and second year man, Bernie Rhomberg, respectively.

Frank Reid of St. Bernard's Seminary will be in charge of the Archery and Scouting Programs and will continue his pioneering exploration groups to the Arrowhead Region.

Assisting in Swimming and Riflery will be Senior Bob Chang of St. Thomas; in Swimming and Boating, Senior Bob Mc Cown of St. John's U.; in Swimming and Trips, Sophomore Jim Brady of the University of Illinois—all three year staff veterans.

On the Marina Dock we will again find Junior Frank Bognanno of Loras; Sophomores, Chuck Landman of St. John's and Tim Power of Nazareth instructing in Sailing and Canoeing while Tim will branch out into some tripping. All are old hands around Camp Foley.

Moving up from junior to senior staff will be Freshman John Otte of Harvard University and Omaha, Nebraska. John, a former camper, will assist in Swimming and Trips.

Two new men in our trip division will be Jerry Repola from Santa Monica, California and Dave Gair of Minneapolis. Jerry is a four year veteran staff member of a Colorado mountain camp while Dave comes to us with two previous years of staff experience in a Minnesota camp.

Our junior staff will consist of four men who have all been members of our Counselor-in-Training program and former campers. Jerry Dotson of Mankato and Bill Goblirsch of Faribault will be joined this season by Bob Klauer of Dubuque and Tim O'Connell of Winnetka. Jerry's speciality is Archery and Photography while Bill, Bob, and Tim will make contributions to the Riflery, Small Crafts, Athletics, and Swimming Programs. One member of our counselor staff is yet to be chosen—when he is — our full count will be 22 men.

### KITCHEN STAFF TO CHANGE

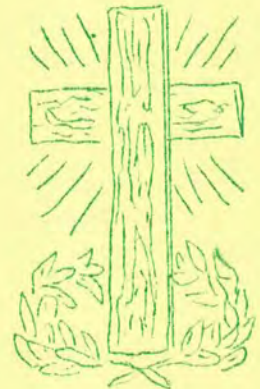
