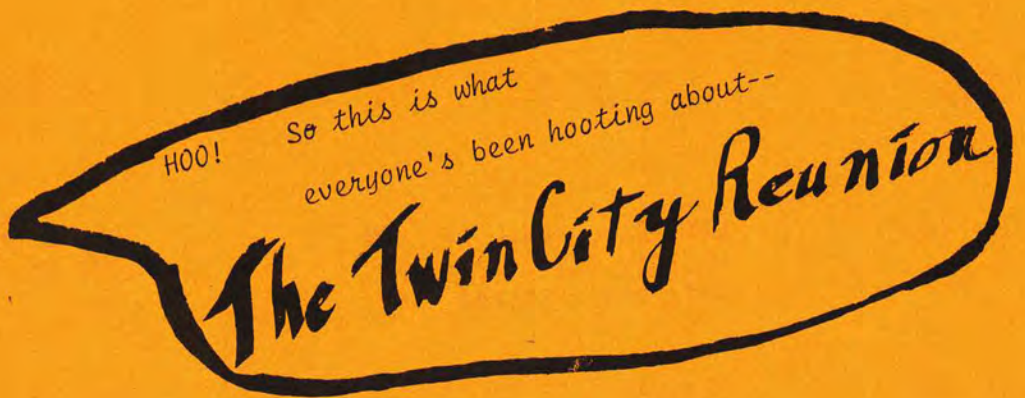

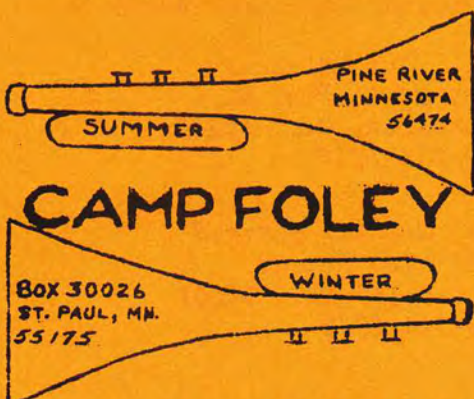

Remember when the A. C. A. accreditation team came to Camp. Many of you campers were interested in how we rated. Their letter to us dated October 20, 1976 stated in part: "I am pleased to inform you that your camp met the certification requirements as a result of the American Camping Association Standards visit this past summer. The high number of affirmative responses recorded by the two visitors indicate a quality program...that you and your staff should be proud of. Certificates of accreditation will be presented ... for the time frame 1976 through 1979."

Mrs. Robert Schmid was one of 50 selected nationally recognized experts in the field of youth camping who participated in and helped conduct the National Symposium of Private Independent Camps of the A. C. A. held in Illinois during November 1976. Major study areas covered in the Symposium included community relationships, communication with the public, social changes and their relationship to child development, and effective management.

The Foley Activity Round-Up

As THE SCHMIDS travel and talk to old and new campers, they are constantly asked about the various activities and if something special is offered. The ROUND UP attempts to cite changes, special events, and new program ideas. What PROGRAM interests YOU?

In compliance with the changes made in the Red Cross swimming program, Camp Foley, in addition to the Beginners through Swimmers instruction, will offer a BASIC RESCUE AND WATER SAFETY COURSE. This will replace the Junior Lifesaving course.

THREE WHITEFISH LAKE REGATTAS are planned. These will give advance sailors a chance to practice their racing techniques. Impromptu, inner camp regattas are held for all to participate in and practice the skills learned in class.

SWIM MEET AND SOCCER GAME -- August 5 with CAMP LINCOLN

TENNIS will again be taught following the WINNER'S MARK INSTRUCTION PROGRAM. This program is used in many tennis camps throughout the United States. Tournaments will be organized between campers to further develop their skill and competence.

RIFLE MATCHES are planned with Camp Lincoln, Mishawaka, and Thunderbird. Our expert shooters will have an opportunity for competition with these camps

Morning one-half day instruction - Western Riding through wooded trails ----- RELAX!! ENJOY!!

GOLFING -- DRIFTWOOD RESORT SCENIC GOLF COURSE
Morning one-half day instruction. Campers travel by boat with a Foley Staff.

OUTDOOR COOKING AND SLEEPING UNDER THE STARS
The variety of trips and experiences offered makes it possible for all campers to sign-up for horseback overnights, early morning ski trips, sail cook-outs, three day canoe trips, overnights, two day canoe trips, BWCA extended trip, and early morning breakfast cookouts. Also, there is an opportunity for you to plan your own trip with your cabin counselor.

CANOE TRIPS--Trippers will remember from '76 such memorable words and phrases as: waves, J-stroke, backwater, heading upwind, rope swing, Te-Pee Island, Big Red, Pine Point, fishing, popcorn, swimming, Hidden Lake, portaging, tunnel, canoe tag, floating bog (or sinking as a few campers found out when they tried to walk on them).

All in all it was a great season for tripping with lots of sun (and Sunburn) and many nice relaxing days on the lakes and islands around Whitefish. Since the rivers were too low to canoe on, the trips were all lake trips. Because of this we didn't have as far to paddle and we had time to relax and enjoy the outdoors and nature. We developed many true and lasting friendships on these trips.

Looking ahead to next year we hopefully, water depth permitting, will be heading back onto the rivers and backwoods of Northern Minnesota. We also, for experienced trippers, are planning a canoe trip to the Little Boy Chain of Lakes. They are beautiful secluded chain of long winding lakes about 35 miles north of Camp Foley. It looks like another fantastic year for the tripping and the excitement is already starting to build. I'm ready for tripping, I hope you are too. See you next summer. *TTM*

MORE ABOUT TENNIS

RETURNING CAMPERS

Did Sheila and Tom remind you to bring your plaques to camp when you return in 1977?

Did you play tennis last fall?

HOW ABOUT SOME SPRING PRACTICE!!!

Learning tennis is twice the fun — when your players have the chance to earn Winner's Marks! First of all, they receive handsome wall plaques made of walnut.

Then, as they progressively master the elements of the game, they're awarded Winner's Marks — which they can proudly affix to their plaques! The Winner's Mark program provides direction and incentive because —

- **every player knows exactly what he or she is expected to accomplish.** Specific, attainable goals have been set for serve, forehand, backhand, volley, special shots (lob, drop, overhead) and match play.
- **every player is awarded instant recognition for his achievements.** As soon as he or she passes one of the tests on court, he or she receives a colorful Winner's Mark plate. Green is for Beginner, Red for Intermediate and Blue for Advanced. As a youngster moves from Beginner to Intermediate the Green Mark comes off the plaque and is replaced with Intermediate (Red). The objective is all Blue (Advanced) which might take 1, 2 or 3 seasons to achieve depending on skill.
- **every player is continually motivated.** Empty spaces on the plaque remind the student of the next steps to be taken, the new goals to reach.

THE SPECIAL TENNIS PROGRAM will again be offered this year--This program will be held at the beginning of each CAMP SESSION during the first two morning sign-up periods for SIX consecutive days. ONLY THE FIRST EIGHT CAMPERS will be able to participate in this SPECIAL SIX HALF DAY PROGRAM.

FOREST FIRE ----- Thanks to the efforts of the Forest Service, some switching winds and a lot of praying, very little shoreline was damaged, very few campsites destroyed, and much to our relief, we're still here.

BACKCOUNTRY UPDATE----- Every year we make several trips into the canoe country either to explore new country, check out a lost portage, refresh our memory, or just enjoy a favorite lake. One particular trip deserves mention. We portaged into the Quetico for some late season fishing. While traveling across an exceptionally scenic lake, we passed close to a rather ordinary, rocky point. All of a sudden Fred looked into the clear water and said, "Wow, look at the size of that fish, and it has a big square tail!" Needless to say, we needed no more encouragement to wet a line. Traveling light and having only one pole, we agreed to take turns casting into the shallows. Our first cast produced a scrappy 5 pound Laker. After 20 casts we hooked either lost or released 20 fish from 3 to 5 pounds, all on one ultra-lite. We kept one of the nicer trout and decided to set camp on this lake for the night. Checking the shoreline, we discovered one of the most beautiful sites either of us had ever seen. A pine needle covered floor provided a soft mattress under towering white and red pines. Completely satisfied with a hearty serving of delicious fish stew, we retired to the thrashings (across the lake, thankfully) of a bull Moose in rut. That Moose probably carried on all night but after our eventful day neither of us heard a thing.

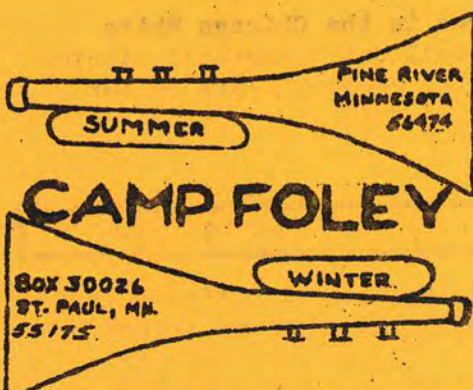

*Each girl selects an activity from the list which she would like to participate in for three consecutive evenings.

*Some of the activities are unique and will only be offered once a session and are not included in the daytime activities.

For example: Gymnastics taught by a certified instructor
Calligraphy, Knitting, Crocheting, Macrameing
Swimming courses like Basic Water Safety and Swim and Stay Fit
Bridge, 500, Hearts, Canasta
Outdoor Cooking and Campcraft Skills
