LAKE SUPERIOR SAIL TRIP, for girls only

This summer for the first time, Camp Foley is offering a four day sail trip to the beautiful Apostle Islands.

THE YACHT: Quicksilver, a C & C 38, owned by Tom Kresbach, is a well maintained 38 foot racing and cruising yacht. Features include: full navigation system, comfortable accommodations for eight, head and shower facilities, complete inventory of sails, auxiliary power, cooking facilities, refrigeration, stereo, and more.

THE CAPTAIN: A certified captain who is very familiar with the area along with one of Camp Foley's sailing staff will supervise the trip. Complete safety is assured.

AGE: Must be thirteen or older with some sailing experience. Talk to your friends.

TIME: The group will leave Foley Sunday, June 27. Orientation by the owner will begin Sunday evening as campers spend their first night aboard. The yacht will leave port early Monday, June 28 and return late Thursday, July 1.

PRICE: Price includes cost of the yacht and captain, food, transportation to and from Foley and quality instruction. Tuition for 1st Session without sail trip is \$480.00. Tuition for 1st Session with sail trip is \$680.00.

*Don't miss this opportunity to experience the adventure and excitement of Lake Superior and the Apostle Islands. Enjoy the fun of sailing while you learn the basics of large yachts.

BOUNDARY WATERS CANOE TRIP 1982, for boys 14 to 16 years of age

B.W.C.A. campers will arrive at camp on June 23, beginning date of First Session. They will have trip preparation for one activity period (1½ hours) for 6 days and one full day prior to departure. It will include canoeing, campcraft instruction, and physical conditioning. The other four periods per day they can enjoy activities of their choice.

Campers will leave Foley, Friday, July 2 with a qualified guide from Foley. Orientation at the outfitters that evening includes planning a route, checking over gear and equipment and preparing for an early departure on July 5th after a nights lodging at Tip of the Trail. Nine challenging days follow in the clear waters of Canada and Minnesota canoeing, fishing, exploring and enjoying the companionship of fellow peers. The route will be of moderate difficulty making a circle into Quetico National Park in Canada. Campers will spend the evening of July 11th at the lodge and return to camp on July 12th to depart on July 13th, the closing date of First Session.

Complete outfitting for 9 days and the 2 nights lodging at Tip of the Trail is included in the \$480.00 tuition fee for the First Session. Additional costs for the trip will include a \$25.00 transportation fee to and from Grand Marais and camp. Extra money is needed to cover the cost of meals enroute, fishing licenses, souvenirs, etc.

This is an opportunity you definately won't want to miss. Next trip to the Boundary Waters will be in 1984.

SAIL - RACING CLINIC, limited enrollment of 10 boys or girls

Prerequisite: Must hold Camp Foley Mate Award or have sailing experience with Tom Schmid's approval.

For the first six days, sailors will sail all afternoon in a concentrated program and may continue to sail in regular sailing periods thereafter. Racing skills and theory are taught by Tom Schmid.

Afternoon races -intercamp competition held daily

Whitefish Chain Yacht Club Regattas where sailors compete with 40-60 boats in five classes.

SAILING

I should like to thank all of you who participated and made the 1981 sailing program a success. There were days during the summer that up to 150 sailing lessons were given; some campers signed up for two periods a day. Because of this participation we are contemplating adding a couple of boats to our fleet. Feedback from campers and staff indicated that sail-racing every day greatly enhanced the skills of all who were involved. Consequently we will race every day possible in 1982.

Last October Lou Ellen and I were able to visit the Virgin Islands in the Carribean. The main purpose was to sail every day and that we accomplished. It was the first time I had ever windsurfed in the ocean - a thrill never to be forgotten. Fortunately, I met a person who owned a sailboard and didn't have to pay \$20.00 an hour rental fee. Also, we were able to use a Hobie Cat 16; reaching speeds up to 20 M.P.H. and going over swells is always fun. To top everything off we sailed a 37 foot O'Day keelboat for a tour of the American and British Virgin Islands, adding to my large yacht and ocean experience.

When I look back at my past sailing trips I realize none of it could have happened if I had never learned how to sail at Camp Foley. Sailing is a sport you can enjoy for a lifetime and it can offer you a lot of excitement. I hope you continue to take advantage of Foley's sailing program in 1982. If you want to learn to sail Camp Foley has your boat.

The highest awards that campers at Camp Foley can achieve are the Voyageur Awards. The Silver Paddle Award is offered to those campers who are under 13 years of age, and the Gold Paddle Award to those campers 13 and over. During the past eleven years, 18 campers have earned the Silver Paddle Award, and only 6 have earned the Gold Paddle Award.

To earn these awards is a great achievement. The two areas of requirements for the awards run on parallel tracks, which are equally important and inseparable. One track requires the camper to achieve a certain level of skill in all major and some minor activities. The other track evaluates the camper's attitude, behavior and interaction with others. Clearly, the camper must live up to high expectations.

A camper must usually work hard for at least three summer sessions to receive the coveted Voyageur Award. This past summer, two campers met the challenge and Camp Foley was proud to honor them with the Silver Paddle Awards.

HELPFUL INFORMATION FOR SUMMER.....

Being prepared for camp can make a camper's experience more enjoyable and fun. This can be achieved by bringing the necessary items from home. In addition to the clothing list that you have or will receive with the medical form, the following items may be most useful at camp:

LIFEJACKET: Every camper needs a U.S. Coast Guard Approved Lifejacket.

BOOKS, GAMES, STATIONARY: There will be times when a camper needs to relax by himself/herself or with the cabin group. Send some good books, card games like No 99, Uno, etc., backgammon, or small electronic games, pencils, pens, paper, envelopes, and stamps to write letters (pre-addressed for younger campers are most helpful).

SAILING--RACING: A stopwatch or a watch with a minute hand is an absolute necessity if the camper has his/her Camp Foley Seaman or above and is interested in racing in intercamp regattas or Whitefish Chain Yacht Club Regattas. How about bringing some good books on sailing?

FISHING: A small compact drop line, complete with hook, weights, and bobber that would fit into a duffle bag would be very useful for the young camper who would like to relax and drop a line into the water.

TENNIS PLAYERS: Bring your racket, balls, and tennis shoes.

HORSEBACK RIDERS: Bring your hard sole boots or shoes--a safety factor for riders.

INSECT REPELLENT (non-aersol) AND FLASHLIGHTS: These items are considered by some campers a necessity. If your child feels he needs these items, please send them with him/her.

SPECIAL DAY--PIRATES: During each session campers and staff will be dressing up as pirates. Bring a costume with you. Perhaps a pair of sweatpants, a t'shirt with homemade drawings of pirate symbols, a bandanna to tie around your head and an eye patch. Information and books on piracy will also help.

***Please note: Some of these items are for sale at the camp store at minimum quantities, styles, brands, etc. for the camper who "forgot". Help keep your camper's expenses at a minimum and send the necessary items. Visit with your child about buying unnecessary items.

THINK ABOUT SUMMER AND SIGNING UP FOR ACTIVITIES

CAMPERS, upon arrival at camp, you will be signing up for 5 activities which you will be taking for 3 days after which you may sign up again. Take a moment and think about the first activities you would like to take. REMEMBER ONLY FIVE ACTIVITIES PER SIGN UP.

*If you have never shot at Foley's rifle or archery ranges you must take these two activities the first sign up to complete your orientation if you are interested in using these facilities while at camp.

**If you are planning to go on a canoe trip, you must take canoeing the first sign up or have passed your Trip Canoeing Award.

NOTE: Waterfront activities have certain swimming requirements. All require that a camper swims 25 yds. and tread water for 10 minutes. For skiing a camper must be qualified as an Intermediate.
