Results of Parents' Survey

Foley thanks all the parents for their cooperation in returning the surveys. We received 55% of the surveys sent which gives us an adequate sample of the Foley population.

Most families became aware of Foley through their families and friends. These referrals accounted for 84% of last year's campers. Thank you for spreading the word. The four main reasons why parents chose Foley for their son or daughter were as follows: well established camp, variety of activities, quality of instruction, and record of safety and supervision.

Most parents (89%) stated that Foley's prices are reasonable; 11% felt they were unreasonable. Quite a few parents (46%) would consider using their VISA-MASTERCARD; however, 54% stated they would definitely not. We are considering adding this convenience in 1985.

The majority of parents (67%) said they are sending their son or daughter back to Foley this summer. Twenty-eight percent were undecided and five percent are not returning. Of the five percent not returning, the main factor was age of the camper.

The bottom line of a camping experience are the benefits received by the camper. Parents felt their son or daughter benefited in the following manner: group living experience - 74%; character development - 70%; activity skill - 68%; and friendships - 68%.

When comparing this survey to previous years, the trends indicate parents are more satisfied with Foley. Our goal is to continue this trend.

SAIL TRIPS

FOR BOYS.

LAKE SUPERIOR - APOSTLE ISLAND

FOR GIRLS

For the third year in a row older Foley campers will embark on a fun and adventurous yacht sail trip on Lake Superior around the Apostle Islands. Learn the fundamentals of large yachts while exploring the beautiful, uninhabited islands. Two separate 4-day trips are offered, one for the girls and one for the boys during the First Session. It could be a once in a lifetime experience. Don't miss it!

The Yachts: Chartered from Sailboats Inc. out of Bayfield. 35-40 foot C & C Yachts. Features include full navigation system, accommodations for eight, head and shower facilities, complete inventory of sails, auxiliary power, cooking facilities, ice box, and more.

The Captains: Certified captains and Foley Sailing Instructors who are familiar with the area will supervise the trips. Complete safety is assured.

Age: Must be 14 or older with some sailing experience. Talk to your friends.

Time: The groups will leave Foley Sunday, June 24. The Yachts will leave the Port of Bayfield Monday, June 25 and return late Thursday, June 28.

Price: Price includes cost of the yacht and captain, food transportation to and from Foley and instruction. Tuition for the 1st Session without sailtrip is \$570.00. Tuition for the 1st Session with sailtrip is \$780.00.

Enrollment: Limited to the first six boys and first six girls who send in their application forms and \$50.00 deposit.

BOUNDARY WATERS CANOE AREA TRIP FOR BOYS

Must be 14 years of age or older

This unique territory full of islands, lakes, rivers and streams is protected by the federal government and Canada to insure its unspoiled beauty. This is your opportunity to explore the wilderness. Meet the challenge of canoeing and camping on the crystal clear lakes of Minnesota and Canada.

B.W.C.A. campers will have trip preparation for one activity period for 6 days prior to departure. It will include canoeing, campcraft instructions, and physical conditioning. Campers will leave Foley on Sunday, July 1 with a qualified guide from Foley. Orientation at the outfitters that evening includes planning a route, checking over gear and preparing for an early departure on July 2nd after a night's lodging at Tip of the Trail. The degree of difficulty of the selected route will depend on the ability of the group but will make a circle into Quetico National Park in Canada. On July 8th, the boys will return to the lodge and travel to camp the following day.

Complete outfitting for 7 days and the 2 nights' lodging at Tip of the Trail is included in the \$570.00 tuition fee for the 1st Session. Additional costs for the trip will include a \$25.00 transportation fee to and from Grand Marais and licenses, souvenirs, etc.

SAIL - RACING CLINIC

Limited enrollment of 10 boys or girls

Prerequisite: Must hold Camp Foley Mate Award or have sailing experience with Tom Schmid's approval.

For six days, sailors will sail all afternoon in a concentrated program and may continue to sail in regular sailing periods thereafter. Racing skills, rules and theory are taught by Tom Schmid. Purchase of a sailboat racing rule book and knowledge of racing is suggested.

Afternoon races - intercamp competitions are held daily. Whitefish Chain Yacht Club Races where sailors compete with boats in five classes. Inland Lake Yachting Association Accredited.

NEW SWIM

Regulations and
Classification Procedure

Campers will be classified into swimming levels by one of the following measures:

- 1) Red Cross classification of previous year of camp;
- 2) Presentation of Red Cross Card or signed note from parent of passed swimming level;
- 3) Camp Foley testing of strokes and skills.

BRING RED CROSS CARDS.

In addition to the above classification, all campers, upon arrival at camp, will do 10 minutes of backfloat, survival float, and treading of water. This lets us know the condition the camper is in and how acclimated he/she is to lake water. It also gives us the security of knowing if a camper is able to handle herself/himself in the water if capsized until help arrives. Keep in mind that swimming in a lake is different than a pool.

Those campers holding the Red Cross Intermediate Card will do 25 yards of each of the following strokes: front crawl, back crawl, elementary backstroke, breaststroke and side stroke. If an Intermediate swimmer is "rusty," she/he will be required to take a swimming review class to improve strokes and endurance for three days. Only if a camper's skills are extremely poor will the Intermediate classification be upheld. Red Cross Intermediate cards are not issued because a camper already has this classification.



FIRST TIME
SNORKLING CLASS

For the FIRST TIME, Foley will be offering snorkeling classes to interested campers. Proper use of mask, fins and snorkel will be taught. Boat trips around the Whitefish Chain will give campers the opportunity to explore different shorelines. Campers who know the basics can check out snorkeling equipment for use during free swim.

WARM UP IN A
SAUNA

A new and most welcomed addition to the swimming facility is a sauna. The sauna will give chilled swimmers a pleasant way to warm up and provide relaxful fun for all. Tom Schmid and Jeff Beltz will be busy designing and building the structure this spring.

NEW EQUIPMENT - NEW PROGRAMS

*A new motorboat trip called "Round the Chain of Lakes" will be offered exclusively for campers 8 to 10 years of age. This camping trip will expose campers to the fun and excitement of exploring the lakes, islands and land on the Whitefish Chain while combining sleeping and eating in the out-of-doors. An excellent opportunity to be on the lake for an extended period of time!

*New nylon tents have been purchased for use in the tripping program. These tents are lighter and more modern than the canvas tree tent used in the past.

*Two new Sunfish have been added to the fleet, making a total of 4 Sunfish to give more campers the opportunity to sail their own craft in order to gain experience and confidence.

*Put on your smiles and comb your hair because the cameras will be taking all sorts of pictures -- individual black and white shots for personal mementos, slides of campers in their cabin groups and participating in the activities, and black and white photos of various aspects of camp for printed newsletters, brochures, etc. A video camera will be taking all sorts of action pictures for fun and learning. This is your opportunity to be a star!
