We would like to extend our congratulations to campers who received some high honors at Foley during the 1984 camping season. The Voyageur Award encompasses all fields of camp life. A camper receiving this award has demonstrated proficiency in a variety of activities, displayed a positive attitude and adjustment to camp life. Very few campers receive this honor. JCSHUA NEWSOME, from Fargo, ND, was the 19th camper to receive his silver paddle - Voyageur Award, the first being given in 1969. This year Foley is having, not one, but three special days. Each session will be different, giving campers who stay multiple sessions a greater variety in program and fun.

First Session: HALLOWEEN

Needed to Bring: a costume

Activities may include: Dunking for Apples, Spook House, "Horrors of Horrors" Skit Night, Costume Parade

Second Session: CHRISTMAS IN JULY

Needed to Bring: Red, white and green clothing, fun Xmas items

Activities may include: Picture with Santa, holiday skits, caroling, presents from Santa, festivities

Third Session: BACKWARDS DAY

Needed to Bring: pajamas decent for the public

Activities may include: "Breakfast", a whole day conducted in reverse -- camp schedule, actions and procedures

BOUNDARY WATERS CANOE AREA TRIP FOR GIRLS

*Must be 14 years of age or older

This unique territory full of islands, lakes, rivers and streams is protected by the Federal Government and Canada to insure its unspoiled beauty. This is your opportunity to explore the wilderness. Meet the challenge of canoeing and camping on the crystal clear lakes of Minnesota and Canada.

B.W.C.A. campers will have trip preparation for one activity period for 6 days prior to departure. It will include canoeing, campcraft instructions, and physical conditioning. Campers will leave Foley on Sunday, June 20, with a qualified guide from Foley. Orientation at the outfitters that evening includes planning a route, checking over gear and preparing for an early departure on July 1st after a night's lodging at Tip of the Trail. The degree of difficulty of the selected route will depend on the ability of the group, but will make a circle into Quetico National Park in Canada. On July 7th, the girls will return to the lodge and travel to camp the following day.

Complete outfitting for 7 days and the 2 nights lodging at Tip of the Trail is included in the \$600.00 tuition fee for the First Session. Additional costs for the trip will include a \$25.00 transportation fee to and from Grand Marais and licenses, souvenirs, etc.

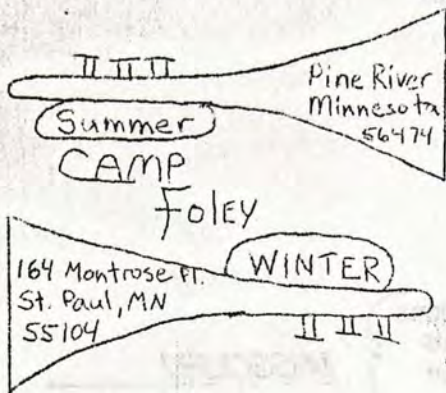

Mike Murrays: is a student at the University of Notre Dame. He will be on the tennis courts and on the soccer field.

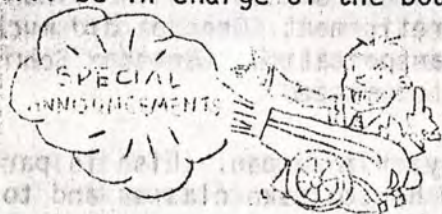
Douglas Porter: is a freshman at Northern Iowa University. Doug will teach fencing, archery, and riflery.

A reminder to all parents: your child is required to have a completed physical form when he/she arrives at camp. In compliance with health standards, if your child does not have a signed medical form, he/she will be taken to the Pine River Clinic for the necessary physical. Parents are responsible for any charge incurred.

SWIMMING CLASSIFICATIONS

Campers will be classified into swimming levels by one of the following measures:

1. Red Cross classification of previous year of camp.
2. Presentation of Red Cross Card or signed note from parent of passed swimming level.
3. Camp Foley testing of strokes and skills.

BRING RED CROSS CARDS.

In addition to the above classification, all campers, upon arrival at camp, will do 10 minutes of backfloat, survival float, and treading of water. This lets us know the condition the camper is in and how acclimated he/she is to lake water. It also gives us the security of knowing if a camper is able to handle himself/herself in the water if capsized until help arrives. Keep in mind that swimming in a lake is different than a pool.

Those campers holding the Red Cross Intermediate Card will do 25 yards of each of the following strokes: front crawl, back crawl, elementary backstroke, breaststroke, and sidestroke. If an Intermediate swimmer is "rusty," he/she will be required to take a swimming review class to improve strokes and endurance for three days. Only if a camper's skills are extremely poor will the Intermediate classification be upheld. Red Cross Intermediate cards are not issued because a camper already has this classification.

RESERVATIONS AND TICKET PURCHASES: Parents are responsible for making and paying one-way or round-trip plane reservations for their child. Schedules are subject to change by the airlines. Below are suggested flights. You may choose another flight arriving on Wednesday before 10:30 a.m. and departing Minneapolis on Tuesday between 2:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. Return tickets will be collected.

SUPERVISION: Camp Foley Representatives will meet all planes at arrival gates and escort camper to their departing flights. Overnight accommodations in the Twin Cities if necessary.

BAGGAGE: Please send all duffel bags with camper. Be sure to use Camp Foley luggage tags on everything checked or carried on.
