What's Happening in 1991

New things

Here are a few things that will be new or different in 1991.

- Two new sailboards.
- A new X-boat will replace the Spindrift.
- Friendship paddles: These miniature 18 inch canoe paddles will arrive in camp unvarnished. Near the end of each session, campers will receive one of these paddles and will spend time collecting autographs from friends, cabin mates, and counselors. After all autographs have been collected, the paddle will be dipped in varnish and left to dry, creating a permanent memento of Camp Foley to take home.

- Cooperative Cabin Award:

This new award will stress cooperation among individuals in a cabin group. Cabin groups will be given certain "tasks" to accomplish as a team. Once these tasks are completed, the cabin group

will earn certificates declaring them members of a cooperative cabin!

- Lunch at the swimdock! Enjoy a nice relaxing lunch at the swimdock with your fellow campers. After lunch enjoy sunbathing, swimming, water volleyball and canteen that comes to you! What a great way to spend a couple hours at camp.

Dances

One dance each session is scheduled to provide a fun evening complete with music, costumes, contests and refreshments.

1st Session Twin Dance

- Plan at home or wait until you're at camp to find a friend or two and dress up exactly like each other.



2nd Session Neon Dance - Bring out all your fluorescent clothing for this one and get ready for a very bright night! Bring your cool shades to protect your eyes from the fluorescent glow!

3rd Session Mask Dance - Bring your favorite mask from home, make a mask at camp, or simply paint your face and come see the grand unveiling at the end of the dance. Enter the best mask contest, too!



Once again, we will have a professional D.J. to do our Second and Third session dances. He has been very popular the last two years and we expect him to help continue the excitement generated at our dances!

Fun Days

Theme days are planned to add more fun, creativity and that "little something extra" to a camper's experience.

Fourth of July during 2nd Session will be full of activity recognizing our country's birthday. An ice cream social and fireworks will be part of the festivities.

Late Night Adventure is on its way back to Foley! The positive response to this event has been overwhelming! Members of the Sioux Tribe will eat pizza, play games and watch movies until the wee hours of the morning, followed by the immensely popular sleep-in.

Sioux Tribe Special... Lake Superior Sail Trip

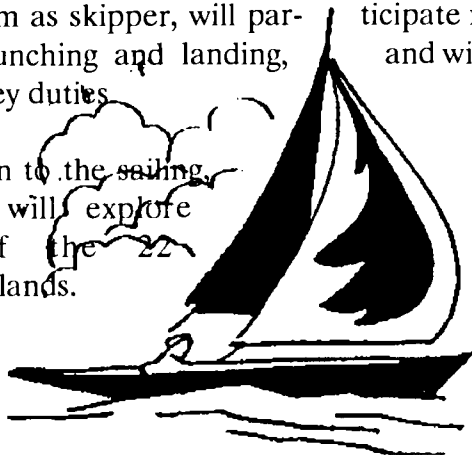
Once again Camp Foley will be offering a Lake Superior Sail Trip during Second Session. Participants in the four day sail trip will learn to safely crew and skipper a deep water cruising sailboat. Campers will be responsible for rigging and unrigging the boat, will spend time at the helm as skipper, will participate in dinghy launching and landing, and will share galley duties.

In addition to the sailing, campers will explore some of the 22 Apostle Islands.

These islands are rich in

history and wildlife. Known for their hiking trails, lighthouses, and secluded wildlife habitat, the islands provide campers a unique opportunity to experience the beauty and history of a truly extraordinary part of our world. Indian settlements are believed to have been established on the islands as early as 4000 B.C. Remains of buildings used in the 17th century by fur traders can be seen on the islands.

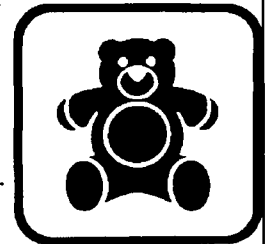
Any camper, age 13 or older, who has some sailing experience can participate in this special program. Cost will be approximately \$300.00.

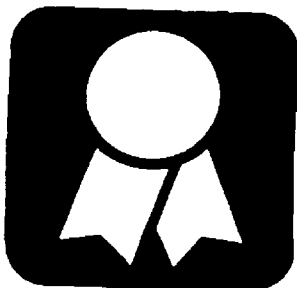
The Bear Facts...

In the past few years, bears have occasionally been sighted in camp looking for food. In 1988, we had a young bear visit camp on several occasions. We became concerned about camper safety with these repeated visits of the young bear. When consulting with the DNR, it was determined that the bear should be destroyed since there were no available live traps.



This summer we had another bear make several visits that ranged from mere sightings to overturning our large dumpster in a hunt for snacks. After contacting our Conservation Officer, he brought a bear trap in hopes of capturing and moving our friend elsewhere. Having the trap in camp created an atmosphere of excitement and adventure. The trap consisted of a six foot piece of metal drain culvert. One end was blocked by bars, the other end had a door activated by a bait can located within the trap. The bear had to enter and attempt to get the bait from the can, causing the door to spring closed.

The trap was set in the center of camp next to the kitchen and dumpster. We never did catch the bear but we did manage to capture a few raccoons and a curious camper (we wanted to make sure it worked!). After a week, the trap was needed elsewhere, so it was removed. Our friend, the bear, was never seen again. If the food supply continues to be sparse, we could anticipate having more visitors like this and we hope to deal with them by using a trap. Camp Foley has a strong environmental focus and believes in allowing wildlife to live freely, but the safety of our camp community will always come first.



Awards!



Gold Paddle

The Gold Paddle is the highest honor that a camper can earn at Camp Foley. In order to receive this award, campers must master skills in a minimum of 11 activity areas. Only 15 Gold Paddles have been awarded since its inception in 1968. During the Second Session of 1990, **Herbie Richardson** earned this award for exemplifying sportsmanship, a positive attitude, and leadership during his 9 years as a camper. Some of the activity areas in which he achieved awards are boardsailing, riflery, canoeing, waterskiing, and swimming. Last summer, Herbie participated in the Camper Leadership Program, received his 6th bar in riflery, and Emergency Water Safety. Way to go, Herbie!

Anchor Award

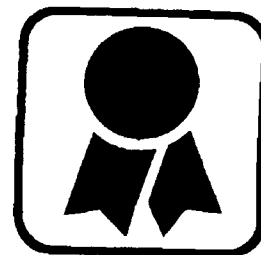

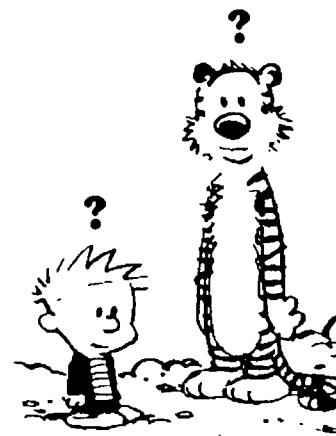

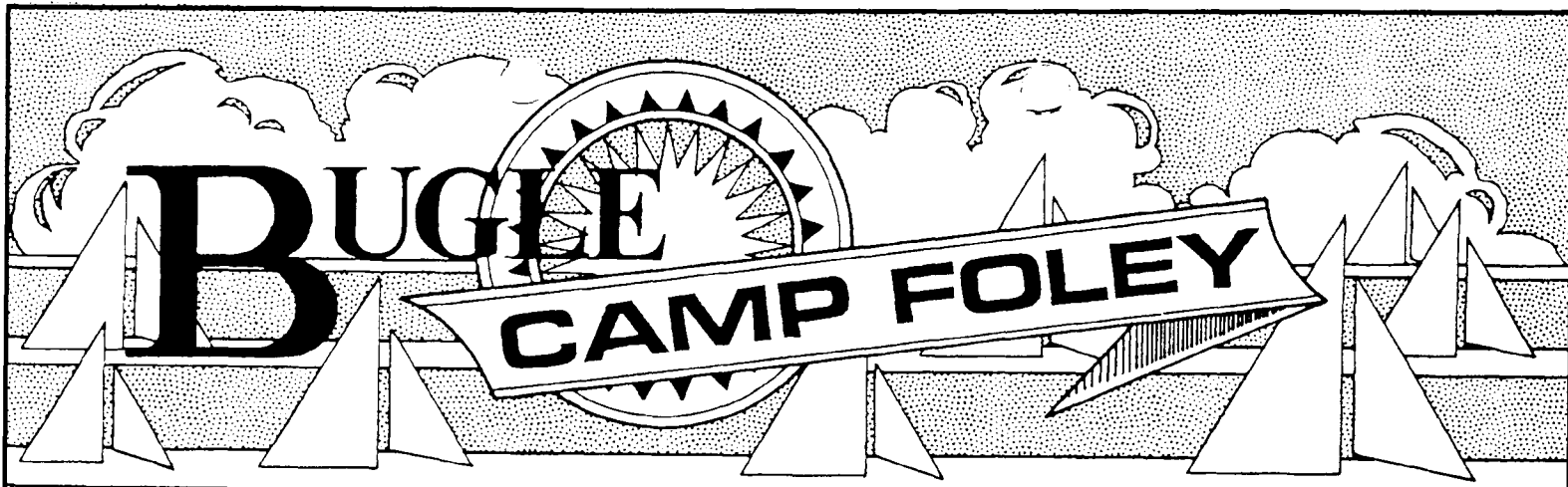

He couldn't wait to make his appearance into the world and is already planning his schedule for the summer of '91 at camp. He thinks his activities will include eating, sleeping, smiling, laughing and swimming in the bathtub. (He doesn't want to get that lake water in his baby blue eyes!)



Foley Helps the Environment

For years, we at Camp Foley have been concerned about the environment and have looked for ways to help conserve natural resources. Our efforts have become habit for the Foley community and we'd like to remind our camp family of how we are doing our part for the environment.

- Bottles, cans, plastics, and cardboard from the kitchen are all recycled.
- Leftover vegetable material from the kitchen is composted.
- Returnable pop bottles are used at Canteen.
- The kitchen uses paper milk cartons instead of plastic. After use, they are cleaned and cut and used as plates (we call them "boats") for picnics.
- The kitchen does *not* use individual serving packages. As much as possible, food items are purchased in bulk and containers are refilled. Sugar is the only item purchased in single serving packages.
- Biodegradable soaps and detergents are used as much as possible in the overall camp operation.
- The camp office uses white paper and recycled paper as much as possible. (Colored paper may use harmful chemical dyes.) The office also uses "junk mail" for scratch paper, reuses mailing envelopes and recycles these materials when they are no longer useful.
- Used rifle targets are used for scratch paper.
- Used brass from expended bullets at the rifle range is recycled.
- The lakeshore was rip-rapped to control erosion.
- We encourage the use of sidewalks to prevent erosion.
- Trees and grass are planted and maintained to control erosion.
- Leaves and brush are composted.
- Lights and radios are turned off when not in use.
- Fertilizers and pesticides are not used. Bat houses have been erected to attract bats, the natural mosquito control in Minnesota.
- An annual garage sale and give-away is held to get unused items to people who can use them and keep these items out of the landfills.
- Trips to town for purchases are limited.



- Promotional video tapes are returned to camp and reissued to other families to lessen the amount of plastics and metals introduced to the environment.
- Items get reused at camp. For example, old sails become tarps or material for shop projects.
- Most importantly we are educating young people by our example.

Persian Gulf Crisis

Many of us are feeling the effects of the Gulf War. Families are separated when a parent leaves for the Persian Gulf and there are uncertainties and fears. Finances for these families have become strained. During first session this year, Foley would like to aid those families who are feeling financial stresses due to having a parent involved in the Gulf War by offering scholarships to their children of camper age. If you know of a family who could benefit from this scholarship program or if your own family could use some help to send your children to camp first session, please contact the camp office. Our thoughts and prayers are with the men and women who are stationed in the Gulf and with their families who await an expedient and satisfactory outcome.



Camp Staff

Camp is already in the process of hiring staff members for the summer. Look who's already committed themselves to a rewarding summer of working with our campers.

ANNE BLANKE: Anne was a counselor for Foley in '90 and will be returning this summer as the Waterskiing Activity Head. She will also be working with sailing and soccer. Anne will be living with our 11 - 13 year old girls. Anne is spending this semester of school working in the Missouri State Legislature.

SEAN FLEMING: Sean has been a staff member at Foley for the past three summers. Having graduated from St. Thomas College in December of this year, Sean has decided to start work early. He will be working in our office this winter and work with the Outdoor Education program this spring. This summer, Sean will be the Assistant Coordinator, the Riflery Activity Head, and will work with staff relations. Sean spent the month of January at a mission in Venezuela and is exploring the possibility of returning to the mission in September as a teacher.

Sail Racing

MOLLIE JUELICH: Mollie is returning as a second year counselor and will teach sailing and boardsailing as well as riflery and biking. Mollie will be a cabin counselor for our Junior Campers and will also live with our 11 - 14 year old girls. Mollie is a freshman at Dayton University.

DENNIS KEFFER: Dennis is a freshman at St. Norbert College and is a first year counselor at Foley. He will be working with our 8 - 10 year old boys and will be instructing soccer and assisting in several areas of camp. Dennis' pleasant personality and enthusiasm will add spirit to the camp program.



JOHN KING: John is from Ballarat, Australia. He will be coming to Foley to work with the boardsailing program. John will be living with our 13 - 15 year old boys. John will also teach our campers about his culture and life in Australia.

MARTIN PEREZ: Martin is returning to Foley for his fifth summer as a counselor. Martin has been coming to Foley from his home in Mexico City for 13 years, having spent 8 years as a camper. Send a Note of Cheer

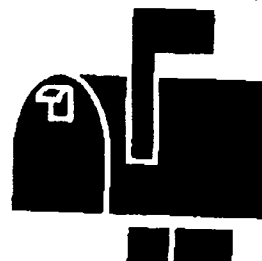
Two of our current campers could use some cheering up. Anyone who knows these campers may want to send a cheery note to let them know that the Foley campers are thinking of them!

Airline Information (cont.)

SUPERVISION: With the increased security at the Minneapolis International Airport some changes have been made regarding staff meeting campers at the gate. At this time, airline procedures are as follows. Please pay attention to the information pertaining to the airline your child will be traveling on so that there will be no confusion at the airport on arrival and departure day.

Northwest, Delta, Midway, and TWA: Staff will meet campers at the gate and will escort campers to the gate on day of departure.

United: Have your child listed as unaccompanied. United has assured us that all campers up to 16 years of age may fly under the unaccompanied designation. If your child is listed as unaccompanied on United flights, staff will be able to meet campers at the gate and escort them to the gate on day of departure.

American: Staff will not be allowed into the gate area. American personnel will escort children from the concourse and staff will meet them at concourse door. American personnel will escort children to the gate on departure day.

Continental: No information at this time.

Check with your airlines when you make reservations for your child. It seems that if you can list your child as unaccompanied, staff will be able to meet him/her at the gate. If you are listing your child as unaccompanied, be sure to do so for the round trip. Peter Kronschnabel and Michelle Rossmiller should be listed as contact persons on the unaccompanied forms. Be aware that these arrangements are subject to change and that by summer we may not have any access to the gate area. Be assured that we are doing everything possible to make sure that your child will be met and cared for upon arrival at Minneapolis. **After Foley staff have met your child, he/she will call home collect to let you know that he/she has arrived safely and has been met.**

Overnight accommodations in the Twin Cities will be made if necessary.

BAGGAGE: Please send all duffle bags with campers. Be sure to use the Camp Foley luggage tags on everything carried on and checked.

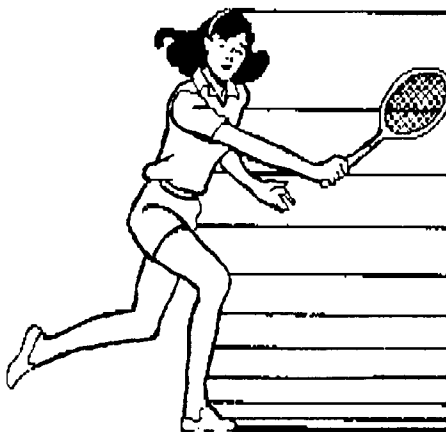
Our continuing profiles of 1991 staff members include:

Airline Information (cont.)

SUPERVISION: With the increased security at the Minneapolis International Airport some changes have been made regarding staffmeeting campers at the gate. At this time, airline procedures are as follows. Please pay attention to the information pertaining to the airline your child will be traveling on so that there will be no confusion at the airport on arrival and departure day.

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United: Have your child listed as unaccompanied. United has assured us that all campers up to 16 years of age may fly under the unaccompanied designation. If your child is listed as unaccompanied on United flights, staff will be able to meet campers at the gate and escort them to the gate on day of departure.

American: Staff will not be allowed into the gate area. American personnel will escort children from the concourse and staff will meet them at concourse door. American personnel will escort children to the gate on departure day.

Continental: No information at this time.

Check with your airlines when you make reservations for your child. It seems that if you can list your child as unaccompanied, staff will be able to meet him/her at the gate. If you are listing your child as unaccompanied, be sure to do so for the round trip. Peter Kronschnabel and Michelle Rossmiller should be listed as contact persons on the unaccompanied forms. Be aware that these arrangements are subject to change and that by summer we may not have any access to the gate area. Be assured that we are doing everything possible to make sure that your child will be met and cared for upon arrival at Minneapolis. After Foley staff have met your child, he/she will call home collect to let you know that he/she has arrived safely and has been met.

Overnight accommodations in the Twin Cities will be made if necessary.

BAGGAGE: Please send all duffle bags with campers. Be sure to use the Camp Foley luggage tags on everything carried on and checked.

News for 1991

Initiative Course

A new cabin activity for '91! This summer, two and three week campers will have the opportunity to test their cooperative work skills with their cabin group when they attempt to complete the new initiatives course. This course is designed to include a series of elements that need to be traversed. No individual can complete the course as designed, group participation is essential for success.

Initiatives in Foley's new course are known as low initiatives. This means that all movement is close to the ground and safety equipment is not required. A sampling of our initiatives include:

1. **The All Aboard.** The object of this is to see how many campers can get on a small platform at one time. To be successful, the entire cabin group must all be on the platform, with feet off the ground, for a period of five seconds.
2. **Spider Web.** All of the campers must move through a nylon web without touching the webbing. Sounds easy? A body can pass through a web opening only once, so what sounds simple at the start becomes more of a challenge as time goes on!
3. **Kitten Crawl.** Campers must make their way from one end of a pair of parallel ropes to the other.
4. **Trust Fall.** Each camper takes a turn falling backward into the arms of their cabin mates and counselors. How much do you trust your cabin mates?
5. **The Wall.** It's almost as formidable as it sounds! Only with true cooperation can the cabin group get all campers over the eight foot wall.
6. **Vertical Log and Tire.** In this initiative, the group must remove and replace a tire which encircles a 12 foot vertical log.
7. **Trolley.** Campers are given props and must move the entire group across an area without touching the ground with any body parts.
8. **The Traverse.** The entire cabin group must go through a series of hanging tires without touching the ground. In addition, the group must transport a "bomb" without "detonating" it!
9. **Mohawk Walk.** Campers have to "walk softly" on this initiative when they attempt to have the cabin group

traverse a suspended cable without anyone touching the ground. Not simple, but great fun to attempt!

Each of these initiative elements provides a means of getting to know and trust cabin mates better, of developing cooperation and of bonding with the group. Best of all, the elements are challenging and fun!

Dances and Special Days

Just a reminder of the special dances and events for the summer of 1991!

DANCES

SESSION I is the Twin Dance. Dress exactly like a cabin mate or friend!

SESSION II is the Neon Dance. Bring your fluorescent clothing and your shades to protect your eyes from the fluorescent glow of our dancers!

SESSION III is the Mask Dance. Bring a favorite mask from home, make one at camp, or paint your face for this dance. There will be a "best mask" contest and a grand unveiling at the end of the evening.

FUN DAYS AND EVENTS

Fourth of July during Session 2 will be full of activity recognizing our country's birthday. An ice cream social and fireworks will be part of the festivities.

International Day will be held during Sessions 1C, 2, and 3. This day will allow campers to experience the culture of other countries by participating in games, crafts, music, and discussions.

Founder's Day during Session 3 will revive the songs, stories, and skits from the early years of camp. Campers will hear a bit of camp's history as well as participate in a old fashioned ice cream social.

Could it be MORNING MADNESS or just good fun? Camp Foley has a new morning wake up for all campers that will have them take part in the funniest, silliest contests that anyone can imagine. Each morning after flag raising, one camper representing their cabin must show their Foley spirit by competing in a silly contest. Official judges will select the top two entries to perform at breakfast. A winner will be awarded a free canteen. Every camper will have at least one opportunity to compete in the contests. What could we possibly have planned for these morning gigglefests? Chicken imitations, cereal eating contests, baby bottle contests, limbo, and balancing acts are just a sampling of what will happen each morning at camp.

Grouped by age within cabins, campers with their counselors, develop a special bond and spirit. Boys and girls ages 8-16 quickly become comfortable and happy in our nurturing and fun environment as they experience our diversified and challenging program. Activities include sailing, waterskiing, boardsailing, riflery, archery, soccer, canoeing, swimming, biking, wood working shop, art, fishing, snorkeling, fencing and more. Our quality staff are caring, enthusiastic, and talented ready to challenge every camper. Campers individually select their activities and set personal goals.

A three week session is truly where campers can fully experience the many dynamics of our camping program. The length is ideal for cabin unity and strong friendships. The personal satisfaction of accomplishing one's goals is really felt. Strong friendships and growth in one's character is vividly seen. The many special group events and the challenging trips are part of these three week sessions. Three weeks give campers ample opportunity to participate in a B.W.C.A. canoe trip or a Lake Superior sail trip and enjoy all of the activities in camp. This session length is our recommendation based on experience of working with young people.

A two week session enables a camper to bond with friends, feel a sense of belonging in the cabin group, accomplish some skills, and become quite comfortable in the camp community.

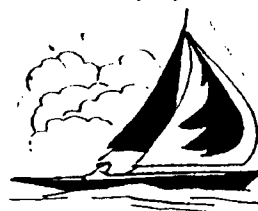
LAKE SUPERIOR SAIL TRIP

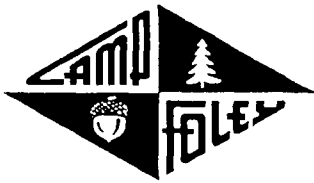
